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What are your expectations for the Foretravel Motorcade Club?

The Club's purpose is to serve our collective interests. How the Club attempts to accomplish this is detailed below.

What we get from our Club dues:

- The Club and Chapter structure including the costs of communication and Board meetings.
- The Motorcader Magazine, quarterly
- The online directory and its maintenance
- Ten percent off on Foretravel of Texas parts and service
- Technical assistance
- Your whole-hearted experience of camaraderie and belonging to the Foretravel family.

What activities are available to us on a pay-as-you attend basis?

- Chapter Rallies
- Grandventions
- Motorcades
- All of the above activities are self funded by the participants. The general Club membership does not underwrite any specific Club or Chapter activity.

Who pays for the Club activity directors?

We do. The Club activity directors scout and conduct Motorcades. The Motorcade participants pay for this service within the Motorcade fee. The directors are not on salary. They are compensated by reimbursement for travel expenses while on Club activities and are provided a per diem rate for Club activities. The Grandvention is manned by the directors for set up, conducting, and tear down of the event.

Who pays for the Club and Chapter officers and the Wagon Masters?

No one. All Club and Chapter officers are volunteers. All Wagon Masters are volunteers.

Who pays for the Club manager?

For the near future, Foretravel, Inc. is paying for the services of the Club Manager and allowing Foretravel, Inc. office employees (Susan King and Sarah Hawthorne) to assist the Club Manager. When this transitional, financial assistance by Foretravel, Inc. ends, the Board of Directors will have to decide what is best for the Club going forward.

One feature of our Club that stands out to me, is that there is no "they" anywhere to be found in our structure. "We" fund ourselves and "we" direct ourselves. There is no outside entity nor influence telling us what to do or benefitting from our efforts. There is only "us" in the Club. We are fortunate to have so many competent Club members volunteering their skills to make the Club function. As a Club member, you also have the opportunity to volunteer your skills and ideas to shape the direction the Club takes. As an organization of members who have done well in life and in business, the skill level of this club's members is impressive. Share your skills with the Club by commenting on how the Club is doing and suggesting on how it could improve. This can be done by providing your input through your Chapter President to the Board of Directors or, more directly, by volunteering your services to your Chapter or to the Club. The Club is only as good as its members make it.

As of now, the State of Texas has accepted our filing to become a non-profit social club. We have secured liability and property insurance for Chapter



and Club officers, wagon masters, and general Club and Chapter functions.

We have confirmation from FOT, MOT, Extreme Graphics, HWH, Aqua Hot, Winegard, Michelin, and Silver Leaf to attend this year's Grandvention in Mineola, TX on Oct 1 - 4. We are still working on MCD shades, Cummins, and Blue OX. As of now FOT and MOT will have coaches at the Grandvention.

On the first full day of the Grandvention, we are holding a first ever, Club member meeting to provide current Club status, offer a Q and A, and to solicit input from members. Even if you are not attending the Grandvention, if you are in the area and wish to attend this meeting, it is open to all members. If you cannot attend this meeting and wish to have input to the meeting agenda, please email Beverly with your suggestions or comments in a timely manner.

Our initial scramble to change the Club into an independent social club has progressed far enough that I can see success in every one's efforts. The legal part is 90% done. The Club policies that caused the recent financial losses are gone. The Club is far along in its efforts to provide improved content for members. Foretravel. Inc. has negotiated to have their coaches sold through dealerships, which will provide a new source of coach owners in the Foretravel community. The Club is being actively supported by FOT, MOT, and Extreme Graphics. I look forward to a very good year.

Greetings from the road,

At the time of this writing, the 2019 "North to Alaska Motorcade" is setting on the beachfront of beautiful Seward Alaska, looking into Resurrection Bay. What a sight to behold with snowcapped mountains and water falls cascading into the bay. Our fellow motorcaders are having the time of their lives, and most are having a hard time believing that we are already on Stop #13 out of #19.

Our Foretravels are so well built that most have experienced no problems at all on this 50 day adventure, but those that have, are more than glad they decided to travel with the Motorcade Club.

One reoccurring problem that seems to keep showing up over the last couple motorcades is with our battery isolator. Foretravel has been using this device on our motorhomes for many years and most are located under the bed, in the engine compartment. The Battery Isolator does exactly what its

name implies. It allows our engine alternator to charge both our house and starting batteries while isolating the battery banks from each other. By doing so, it will never allow you to discharge your starting batteries by using house lights and other appliances, while not hooked up to shore power or running the generator. The Battery Isolator accomplishes this by the use of a set of diodes which allow 12 volt DC current to flow in one direction only. Over time these diodes degrade and begin to heat up as current flows through them. The hotter they get the more resistance and less voltage they allow to pass through them. In time, they will fail completely not allowing the alternator to charge the batteries.

In the last year alone, we have replaced 4 Battery Isolators on Motorcades. The year models that failed range from 1999 to 2006, which leads me to believe that, depending on use, the average life of the Isolator is somewhere around 15 years.



All the symptoms seem to follow a pattern of low voltage showing on the instrument gage one day, and then normal voltage the next. Many times owners suspect the alternator or voltage regulator is the culprit when in actuality, the Isolator is not allowing the voltage to pass through to the batteries. A quick easy way to check an Isolator for failure is to hook a volt meter or test light from a battery ground source to the center post of the Isolator, without the engine running. You should have no voltage. If you have any voltage at all or if your test light glows, you have a diode failure and the Isolator needs to be replaced.

REMEMBER: If you suspect your alternator is going out, test the Isolator. At less than one third the costs, you just might save yourself a chunk of change.

THE FORETRAVEL WAY

Crock pot Hamburger Potato Casserole

Cook time: 4 hours Serves: 10

INGREDIENTS

5 small potatoes

1 - 2 lbs of ground beef

2 cans cream of mushroom soup

1 cup of milk

salt and pepper to taste

 $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups of shredded cheese

INGREDIENTS

- 1. Brown your ground beef and set aside.
- 2. Peel and slice potatoes and set aside. We use this easy mandolin slicer to cut our potatoes quickly.
- 3. In a mixing bowl, combine cream of mushroom soup, milk, salt and pepper to taste. Mix well. Set aside.
- 4. Spray crock pot casserole dish with non-stick spray.
- 5. Layer in the pan, potatoes, beef, soup, and cheese. Then repeat. Top with remaining cheese.
- 6. Place lid on top.
- Cook on high for 3 4 hours or until the potatoes are soft.
- Turn off the crock pot and allow it to cool slightly (about 10 minutes). This will allow the casserole to thicken.
- 9. Cut and serve with your favorite vegetable.

Brown Jugar Pound Cake

Caramel Drizzle Recipe

Ingredients: (makes 1-1/2 cups) 1 - 14 ounce can

sweetened condensed milk 1 cup brown sugar, packed 2 tablespoons butter 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

Directions

In a medium saucepan, combine condensed milk and brown sugar; bring to a boil over medium-high heat, whisking frequently. Reduce heat, and simmer for 8 minutes, whisking frequently. Remove from



heat; whisk in butter and vanilla. Let cool for 5 minutes before using.

Brown Sugar Pound Cake Recipe (serves 12 to 16) Ingredients

- 1-1/2 cups butter, softened2 cups light brown sugar, packed5 large eggs3 cups all-purpose flour1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup whole milk
- 1 8 ounce bag of toffee bits
- 1 cup pecans, chopped
- 1 recipe CARAMEL DRIZZLE

Directions

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Spray a 12 cup Bundt pan with nonstick baking spray with flour. Set aside.

Beat the butter until creamy. Add sugars, beating until fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. In a medium bowl, combine flour, baking powder, and salt. Gradually add flour mixture

to butter mixture in thirds, alternately with milk, beginning and ending with flour mixture. Beat until just combined. Stir in toffee bits and pecans. Spoon batter into prepared pan. Bake until a wood pick inserted near the center of cake comes out clean, 85 to 90 minutes. TIP: Cover the top with foil to prevent excess browning is necessary. Let cake cool in pan for 10 minutes. Remove from pan, and let cool completely on a wire rack. Spoon Caramel Drizzle over cooled

POLICIES RESERVATIONS

A \$500.00 deposit per event is required at the time of reservation. Full payment is due 90 days prior to the activity start date. A second deposit may be required and is due upon billing. Reservations may be made by mail or telephone by using your MasterCard, Visa, or Discover credit card. Failure to make required payments will result in losing your place in the sign-up rotation.

CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS

If reservations are canceled 90 days before the event, your deposits will be refunded less any unrecoverable monies retained by vendors from deposits made on member's behalf. If cancellation falls within 90 days prior to the beginning of the activity, 20% of the fees paid will be retained to cover the cost of postage, printing, supplies, bank charges, etc., plus any charges for any actual cost from guarantees and/or deposits made on member's behalf. No shows can result in no refunds. All refunds (except in very serious cases) will be charged 20% of the event fee plus actual cost from guarantees and/or deposits made on member's behalf.

Some special events have their own cancellation policies.

GUESTS

Arrangements and/or registration for all guests should be made upon registration or no later than 90 days prior to the start of any event.

STANDBY LIST

Space is limited on many events. All reservations are recorded in the order initial deposits are received. If received on the same day, they are handled in a lottery style manner. When a cancellation occurs, the first on the standby list is notified to fill the opening. Do not hesitate to sign up when discovering there is a standby list for an event. Very seldom have we had any standbys remaining at the start of an event.

SCOUTING AN EVENT

This occurs approximately one year prior to running the event. Pricing and finalizing with confirmation of all tours and attractions for each event take approximately four to six months after scouting is completed. Dates are tentative. Pricing and confirmed dates will be published in the Motorcader magazine.

You will be issued an EFS card.

Insert your EFS card into the fuel pump.



A prompt will show to ask for specific information that verifies the owner. You enter the correct information and pump your diesel.

The next day the money is drafted from your bank account and you receive an email showing you the details of the transaction and our fees.

Their fee is 10% of the savings per gallon. So if the retail cost is \$3.00 per gallon and our cost is \$2.50 per gallon, your fee will be 5 cents per gallon.

If they can't save you money, you owe nothing!

There are no long-term contracts to sign and no hidden fees. If you choose to not use the program any longer, simply don't use the card.

After the long rigorous treatments from March to August 2018, the BMT team declared that George was cancer free. We had a nice celebration with George's seven magnificent caregivers who were also "Uber" volunteers during the entire daily treatment at Northside Hospital when George couldn't drive. We are deeply grateful for your prayers and positive thoughts for George and me. It's a miracle to have seven caregivers' helping us with copious energy and countless time. We believe those sterling caregivers were a godsend because of your love and prayers.

George's cancer-free status was short-lived to enjoy. The chemo-induced neuropathy in George's right leg necessitated further treatments and consequently, he has less mobility in daily life. Before 2018 ended, George needed radiation and intrathecal chemo to protect the blood-brain barrier due to a secondary cancer. Although recovery is slow, we are grateful. George can drive!

We needed a temporary repair until we could get the coach to Cummins to replace any other hoses, flush the radiator and replace the coolant with ELC. "The Road to Foretravel" as shared by Randy & Karen Crete

Our love for camping started in the 1970s while in college. Karen was always ready to go camping and we were young enough where a good night of sleeping was possible in a tent. A few years later

after our two boys arrived, we bought our first "camper", a pop up. A new Coleman with king size beds on both ends and a roof top AC...throw the two boys up on one end and a good night sleep for mom and dad. We ran the rig till the boys were in high school. When we became empty nesters, Karen found a Heartland 30' 5th wheel which we used several years before selling.

The RV Supershow in Tampa has always been a fun annual trip for us. As we neared retirement, we began to look more closely at motorhomes, especially those with more of a vintage look and shorter than 36'. After attending the 2017 RV Supershow, we headed up to Lazydays in Tampa to check out several rigs we'd seen on YouTube videos. The salesman showed us what they had on the lot. We were disillusioned with the quality. He then took us to the service area and stopped to show us a 1990's Country Coach they had begun to renovate. He told us that the 1980's through early 2000's were the great years for motor coach manufacturing and Karen immediately recognized the guality of the hardwood interiors. This took us in a new direction. We "googled" high quality motorhomes and discovered the name Foretravel, which was previously unfamiliar to us. From there, we guickly discovered Foreforum, the Foretravel Owners Forum. It provided the same welcoming community of experienced users we'd discovered on the other forums and we were hooked. Hours and hours later we'd researched the history of the brand and learned about Nacogdoches, the home of Foretravel. We discovered several websites, i.e. Foretravel.com, the factory website, Motorhomesoftexas.com, a large Nacogdoches dealer in used motorhomes and Beamalarm.com, a site maintained by an experienced Foretravel owner that cataloged virtually all previous year's model brochures and floor plans. Hours and hours later we had our list of "desirable" models and floor plans and we'd begun our hunt for "our" Foretravel. Everyone has their "ideal" floor plan and coach length. For us was the elusive 34' short Foretravel. The model made in the smallest number. In January 2017 at the Tampa RV Supershow, we had a chance to meet and visit with some of the Florida Foretravel Chapter members who annually hold a rally during the show. This gave us a chance to not only make friends, but also see a variety of Foretravel coaches. What a welcoming community we discovered! Everyone was so friendly and encouraging! This was the beginning of new friendships. A few months later we saw a 34' Foretravel online and flew out to Nacogdoches to take a look. It had been sold and delivered the day before our arrival. We visited the Foretravel factory and met with Tyle Fore and then went to Motorhomes of Texas and met with Mel Cordray. A special treat was the time we spent other Foretravel owners, Mike and Jackie Harbordt who are longtime Nacogdoches residents. They showed us real Texas hospitality. Little did we know that less than a year later we'd be back to Texas to buy that same 34' Foretravel we'd missed seeing on this trip. We named her "Ole Red". Then in early 2018, after Randy's retirement, we embarked on our first Foretravel adventure. This 8,617 mile-six month trip took us through the southwest towards California and Oregon where we spent most of our time. We then returned home to Florida by way of Colorado and Kansas, before stopping in Arkansas and New Orleans. We chronicled our travels on our blog 'CampingForTheRestofLife.com'.

After our initial trip, we decided to reconnect with the Florida Foretravel Motorcade Club members. We attended our first chapter rally in Palatka and six months later attended the rally in Daytona Beach. The Florida Chapter has a diverse membership. We like that some members are still working, and others are retired. We enjoy the camaraderie and educational opportunities presented at the rallies. So, we have decided to do our part and set involved to help our object and with rank of the rank

part and get involved to help our chapter remain active and vibrant for the years ahead. This year Karen is the Treasurer and Randy is slated to become the VP next year. We have found the commitment to be minimal and to be very worthwhile.

This year, our travels take us through the Midwest and Canada. We're in search of cool temperatures and hope that our return to Florida in November will allow us to experience fall colors from Canada all the way back to Florida.

Who knows where our adventure takes us next year... but with our Foretravel friends, we'll have a wealth of ideas."
